

ADAM GOLDBERG is the chief of the Financial Integrity and Analysis Branch in the Office of Federal Financial Management within the U.S. Office of Management and Budget. He is responsible for coordinating OMB's efforts to implement government-wide management improvements in the following areas: financial systems, improper payments, asset management, and charge cards. Mr. Goldberg also plays a leadership role in coordinating OMB's review of agency efforts under the financial management line of business as well as the Financial Performance, Improper Payments, and Real Property initiatives under the President's Management Agenda.

Mr. Goldberg began his career working in the Comptroller's Office at the Defense Logistics Agency.
