

**JOSEPH KULL** is a director in PricewaterhouseCoopers' Washington Federal Practice focusing on improving public sector budget, financial, and grants management and performance. He is actively working to bring XBRL into the public sector information supply chain.

Mr. Kull retired after 32 with the federal government and almost 20 years as an SES. His last position was as the deputy comptroller for federal financial management at the U.S. Office of Management and Budget.

Previously, Mr. Kull spent almost 16 years at the National Science Foundation, as chief financial officer and budget director (1991-2000), and as deputy director of the Office of Budget, Audit and Control (1984-1991). Mr. Kull spent almost 12 years at the Civil Aeronautics Board as comptroller and budget director. He began his career as an auditor in the New York office of Arthur Andersen & Co.

Mr. Kull received a B.S. from Mount Saint Mary's College in Maryland and his M.B.A. from George Mason University in Virginia. He is a CPA, a CFGM, member of the Association of Government Accountants and the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants, and taught accounting at the Northern Virginia Community College for 17 years. He is teaching governmental accounting at the University of Maryland's Graduate School of Public Policy.

He continues to serve on a number of professional boards and committees, chairs or co-chairs professional conferences and symposia, has testified before Congress, and presents at various professional events.
