

JOHN RADFORD has many years of government financial management experience. In 1983, he moved to Oregon and began work as chief budget officer in the Oregon Judicial Department and was promoted to Management Services Director in 1985. In 1989, the governor appointed John to the position of state controller where he has served in this capacity under five Oregon governors. He is a member of the Oregon Statewide Audit Committee and the Audit Committee of the Oregon Department of Education.
