

## **Michelle Sager**

Michelle Sager is an Assistant Director in the Strategic Issues team at the U.S. Government Accountability Office (GAO). She is currently part of the team leading GAO's mandated bimonthly reviews of states' and localities' uses of federal funds flowing from the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act. Since joining GAO in 1998, she has served as an adjunct faculty member, internal consultant on research methods, and project manager for international trade and intergovernmental relations reports, testimony and briefings. Her work at GAO has included a broad portfolio of intergovernmental, federal, and international trade policy issues. Her experience as a "pracademic" also includes positions as an adjunct faculty member at Johns Hopkins University's Institute for Policy Studies and George Mason University's School of Public Policy.

Prior to joining GAO, she served as a research fellow and instructor at George Mason University's School of Public Policy and Department of Public and International Affairs. Her experience with intergovernmental policy issues began while serving as legislative staff in the Missouri House of Representatives and continued during positions on a congressional campaign and in the U.S. House of Representatives.

Ms. Sager received a Ph.D. in Public Policy and M.A. in International Commerce and Policy from George Mason University in addition to a B.A. in Communications and Political Science from Truman State University. She is the author of a book and other publications on federalism and international trade.
