



Coronavirus Relief Fund Spending Data at PandemicOversight.gov

On November 30, 2020, the PRAC released the first publicly available Coronavirus Relief Fund (CRF) spending data for July 1-September 30, 2020. Also for the first time, this CRF dataset includes data at the project level with sub-recipient spending data. Read below for additional details about this dataset, now available at PandemicOversight.gov.

The U.S. Department of the Treasury made available \$150B in Coronavirus Relief Funds (CRF) to states, eligible local governments, Tribal governments, the District of Columbia, and the U.S. Territories (i.e., prime recipients).

Prime recipients must report on sub-recipient spending for greater than or equal to \$50k. For expenses less than \$50k, prime recipients report total amounts by funding type (e.g., grants, contracts, loans). A total of 785 prime recipients received \$149.5B in CRF. Out of those recipients, 760 each received at least \$150k and must report under the CARES Act.

Expenditure categories for CRF funds include COVID-19 Testing and Contract Tracing; Economic Support; Food Programs; Medical Expenses; and Public Health Expenses.
